ORGAN PRELUDE

The choir will not process this morning. We will begin our service at 11am with two minutes of silence. At 11 am on 11 November, 1918 the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years continuous warfare. The allied armies had driven the Germans back, having inflicted heavy defeats upon them over the preceding four months. In November the Germans called for an armistice (suspension of fighting) in order to secure a peace settlement. They accepted the allied terms of unconditional surrender. From 1919, Armistice Day was marked with 2 minutes silence at the 11th hour to remember the fallen of WWI. After the end of the Second World War, the Australian and British governments changed the name to Remembrance Day. As we commemorate the centenary of Armistice Day, we reflect on all times of war that Australia has been involved in, we remember the fallen, but we also pray for those who returned, many damaged physically, emotionally, and spiritually. We also think of our current serving Defence force members, and above all, we pray for peace in our world.
