Resurrection happened because Christ was first prepared to die. Defying death, he refused to release his hold on life and love. So now, as he encouraged us, we choose to remember so that we too can truly live.

At supper on the night before he died Jesus took bread and blessed it.

Then he broke it and gave it to his disciples saying:

**This is my body, broken so that you may know life. Eat it and remember me.**

After the meal Jesus took wine and blessed it.

Then he gave it to his disciples saying:

**This is my blood, shed so that you may know life. Drink it and remember me.**

So, now, Lord of Life, we share in this meal, we celebrate together, and we remember you. And we will continue to do this until resurrection has flooded the whole creation.
